Single Sentence Abstract	Rolfing Library gathered input from TEDS faculty and alumni regarding their awareness of and satisfaction with Library services and resources, both during their time at Trinity and since their matriculation or while preparing personal research, using an electronic survey and comparing circulation/interlibrary loan data from users, and found that though students and faculty may have been aware of resources while they attended TIU, they are unaware of their continued access to resources after matriculation.					
Motivation(s) for Project	As one of the largest producers of evangelical PhDs in the U.S., university administration requested that the library assess how the library supports PhD scholarship, especially in light of spring 2020 accreditation visits. As many of the faculty are also prolific scholars, we chose to include them in our study as well. Understanding how the library is supporting our students, and continues to support them after matriculation, will hopefully help the library to prioritize limited resources.

Method(s) of Data Collection and Analysis	All participants will complete an electronic survey administered through CrowdSignal.com. Additionally, historical information gathered through ILLiad transaction history regarding library use during the 2012-2017 period will be utilized by matching library use with participant responses (when possible), then anonymizing all data and responses.				
Findings	Initial analysis of responses found that while respondents are aware of resources during their time as a student or faculty member, alumni are unaware of their continued access to library resources after matriculation. Unfortunately, the survey only resulted in 25 completed responses, so we are unsure if these findings are accurate/true for all users.				
Use of Findings	At this time, plans are being made to investigate how the library can advertise to alumni more successfully. Other uses may be forthcoming after next steps are taken.				
Next Steps and Other Results	Due to the low response rate, next steps are to reconfigure and reimplement the survey. Since embarking on this project the library has formed a partnership with university advancement. As part of this partnership, the new survey will be amended to gather additional needed data to investigate the creation of a Friends of the Library group. Survey amendments will include: • Removal of "faculty" questions, focus will be on alumni only • Broaden academic program categories to include all alumni, not just from TEDS programs or specific matriculation range. • Add "partnership interest" questions: Are alumni willing to partner with the library in any way?				

Additional Reflections	After reflection, it was hypothesized that low response rate can be partially attributed to two things: 1) The timing of the survey launch corresponded with summer vacation for our faculty, and prime vacation season for many of our alumni; and 2) The survey ended up being very long/took longer for participants to complete than administrators expected. Plans for the relaunch of the survey include a launch period during a different time of the year, as well as major restructuring/elimination of survey questions. Since the participant group will also be changing, the survey will be sent out to all alumni, and we anticipate a much larger response. Additionally, alternative methods of advertising are being investigated, with the goal of reaching as many participants as possible.
