## “The Legacy of Brown versus Board of Education: Its Impact of Multicultural Education” (2004)

- Grant funded collaborations between nine Illinois libraries via Illinois Cooperative Collection Management Program
  - Total project cost: \$24,000
  - Range of library commitment: \$2,500 to \$4,000
- Covered multiple facets of multicultural education: administrative, legal, curricular, admissions, pedagogy, and children’s literature

## “The Legacy of Brown versus Board of Education: Its Impact of Multicultural Education” (2004)

- All library collaborators make purchased materials available for circulation via ILLINET and Interlibrary Loan
- All library collaborators catalog materials within six months of receipt
- All library collaborators agreed to communicate progress in the project

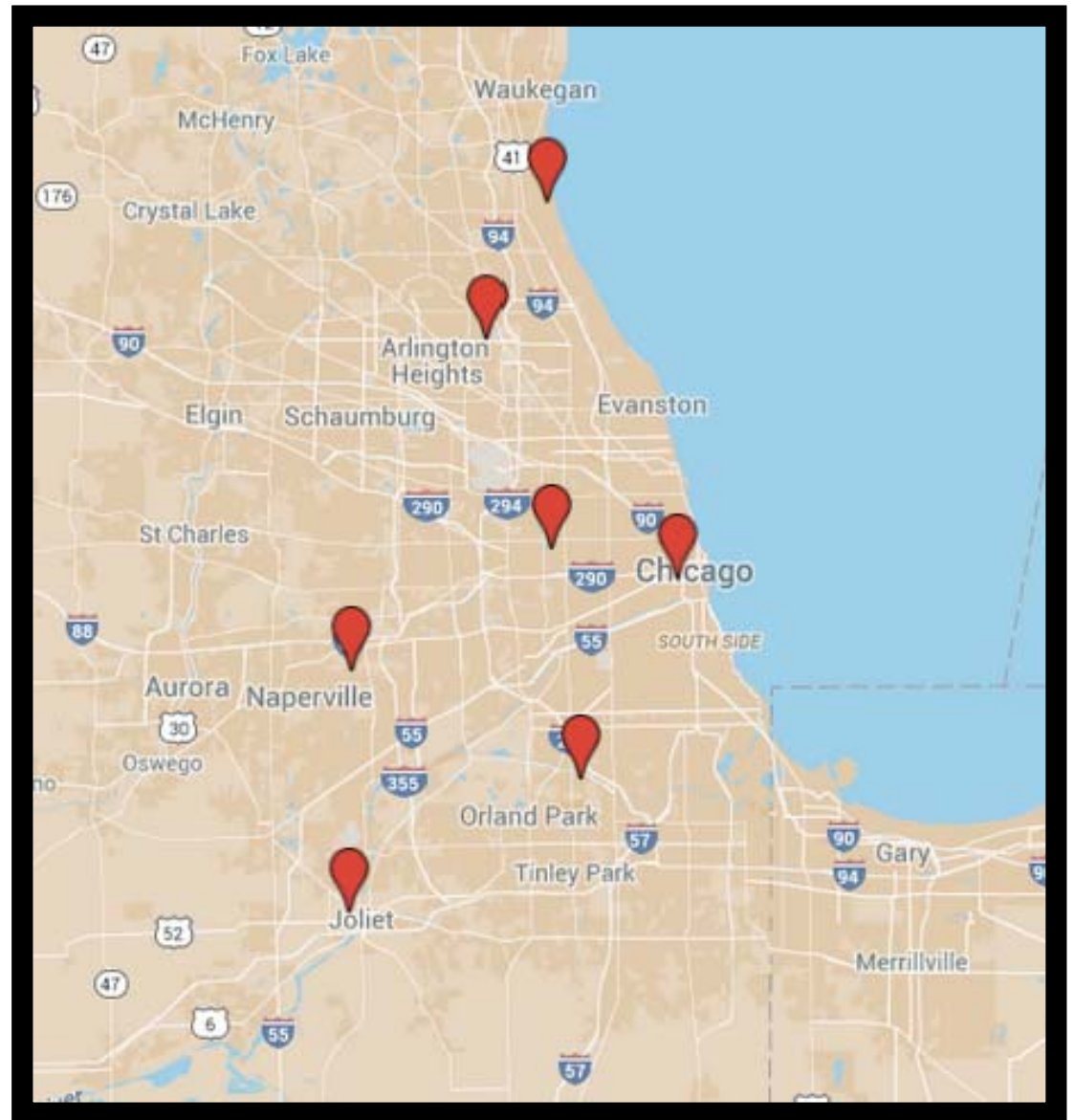

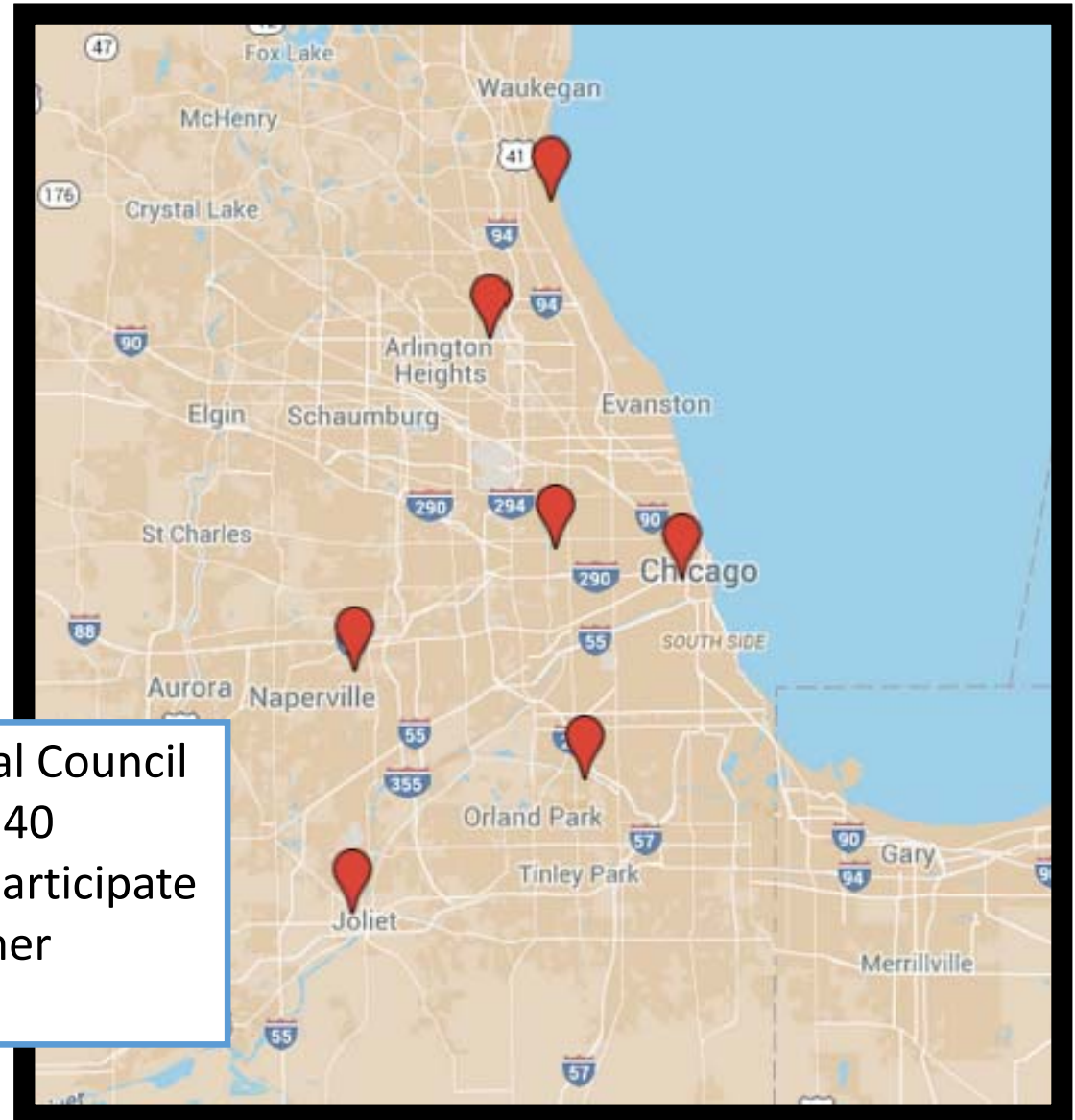
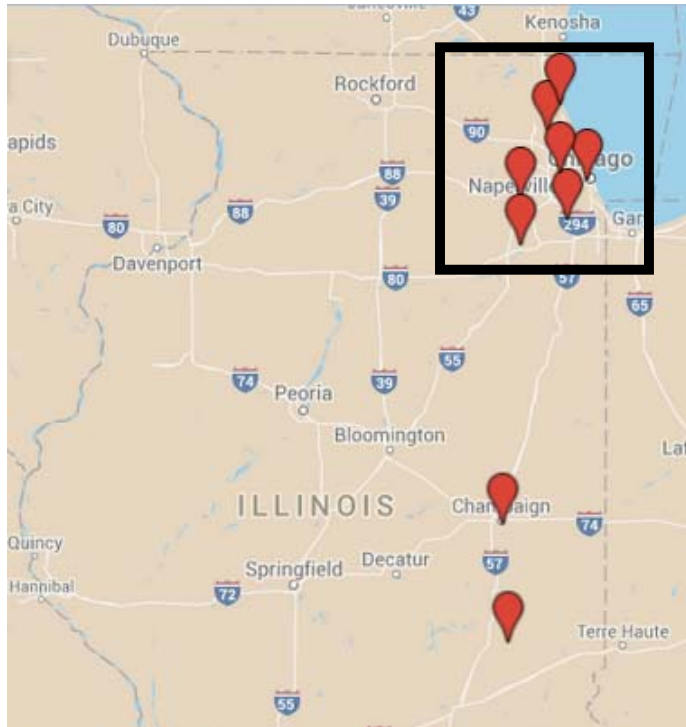
