Quality, Retention, Completion & Attainment

*A large scale study (21,822 students) looked at impact of OER adoption.

- *Resulted in overall improvement of course grades for all students.
- *Most improved were those most at risk: Pell grant recipients, non-traditional, part-time, and those historically underserved by higher ed.
- *Non-white students' grade improvement most compelling.

- *Publicize OER initiatives already in process on your campus.
- *Offer alternative ways for faculty to become involved.
- * Celebrate Successes At least 45 faculty members teaching 60 classes report they are or will use OER alternatives
- * Results from IDEA surveys indicate students want, need & greatly appreciate this option.
- * Create a sense of urgency.

*Two Tracks available

- *Review an existing textbook and publish your review in Open Textbook Library
- *Adoption is encouraged, but not required
- * \$200 stipend

- *Create a fully fleshed out syllabi using OER or subscribed resources for a new or significantly revised course
- *Adoption required for at least one term
- * \$300 stipend
