What is Copyright?

Copyright has come a long way since its inception in 1710. The first copyright law was created to protect the livelihood of authors as books were being copied and printed. Today, copyright protects many types original works as soon as a creator fixes their idea into a tangible expression. Copyright can vary from country, but for the most part copyright is automatically attached to a work once it is created. 

- Once a copyright expires (e.g. author's life plus 70 years in the U.S.) a work goes into a space called the public domain.
- These works are free to use and do not need creator permission any longer.
- A creator can also dedicate their work to the public domain before copyright expires!

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Famous Works in the Public Domain



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- Each country has their own variations of exceptions to copyright so that there are not complete monopolies to works.
- In the U.S., fair use allows for limited uses of copyrighted material:
- Criticism
- Commentary
- Research
- News reporting
- Teaching
