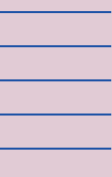
WHAT IS A COLLECTION?



Collections are an artifact that assembles various works into a single document in which each work retains its own uniqueness and distinction.



Each item in the collection should include its original licensing information to credit the creators and there should be a separate license for the collections as a whole to credit to work of the compiler.



Remixes and adaptations similarly combine works from multiple creators however the distinction and uniqueness is removed. It should be "an original expression" based on the combination of other works. You might also hear these called "derivative works"

Not every change to an original work is an adaption, though. Some common changes that aren't considered a remix/adaptation/derivative are:

- Taking excerpts from a larger work
- Changing the format of a work (like .docx to .PDF)
- Changing small portions of a work like spelling or grammatical errors.

If you're making an adaption, you'll need to be mindful of the CC licenses attached to all of the works you are using. In general:

- If the underlying work is licensed under a NoDerivatives license, you can make and use changes privately but you cannot share your adaptation with others, as discussed above.
- If the underlying work is licensed under a ShareAlike license, then ShareAlike applies to your adaptation and you must license it under the same or a compatible license. More on this below.
- You need to consider license compatibility. License compatibility is the term used to address the issue of which types of licensed works can be adapted into a new work.
- In all cases, you have to attribute the original work when you create an adaptation.

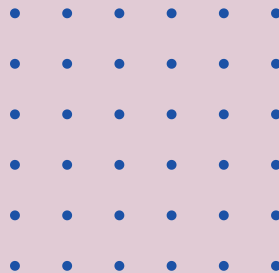

HELPFUL CHARTS FOR REMIX/ADAPTATION/DERIVATIVE LICENSING
