## CARLI CONTENTdm Server Migration/Upgrade Completed

The CARLI Office has successfully completed the upgrade to CONTENTdm software version 5.4, and the migration to a new CONTENTdm server. All user account access has been re-enabled and libraries may once again use the Project Client and Web Administration.

## E-Resources: Mobile Access for your Library Databases

CARLI staff are researching mobile access to the databases offered by our e-resources vendors. Vendors have chosen a variety of methods to provide mobile access to their resources. The process for authentication varies among vendors, as well as the ability to access full text articles. We encourage each institution to verify access procedures for their patrons. CARLI has created a [Mobile Access web page](#) to serve as a central resource for mobile access information. We will update that web page with additional information as it becomes available.

### [Alexander Street Press Streaming Music Collections](#)

Patrons of subscribing libraries can listen to ASP's complete line of streaming music collections from internet-enabled smart phones and other mobile devices. Wherever the "send to mobile" icon is displayed, users may obtain a shortlink via text message or email, or may enter the shortlink directly into their mobile web browser to enable playback on their mobile device. On supported devices, users can also have their device read a special barcode, or QR-Code, directly from the computer screen.

### [American Chemical Society ACS Mobile](#)

ACS Mobile provides readers with a searchable stream of peer-reviewed research content published across ACS's scholarly research journals, including the Journal of the American Chemical Society. Interested users may download the [iPhone app](#) (\$4.99.) Users will access full text using a campus or library wireless system or by authenticating through their institution's proxy. For detailed information is available on the [ACS web site](#).

### [ARTstor Mobile](#)

Search, and view ARTstor's digital images, including the "flashcard view." The mobile application is currently limited to iPhone, iPad, iPod and products using Safari 4+. Users who are not authenticating through their institution's proxy will require a user ID and password from their institution's e-resources administrator to log in from their Smartphone.

### [EBSCOhost Mobile](#)

The EBSCO mobile web site provides basic searching, HTML and PDF full text, multi-database searching, emailing articles. Users who are not authenticating through their institution's proxy will require a user ID and password from their institution's e-resources administrator to log in from their Smartphone.

### [GALE AccessMyLibrary College Edition](#)

Interested users may download the free iPhone app to access to subscribed databases and ebooks from Gale. Following download, users will be asked for their Institution email address. Gale will send a password to the email address that will be used this to complete the login. No further logins will be required for the current school year. Once logged in, users click on "Update My Library" to get a list of available resources.

### [JSTOR Mobile](#)

Use JSTOR's mobile-optimized web interface for smartphones. Users not accessing JSTOR using a campus or library wireless system must authenticate through their institution's proxy.

## [Nature](#)

The Nature web site provides detailed information on using this free iPhone app to access science news stories and published research from Nature Publishing Group. Users will need to register for a free account after the app is downloaded to their mobile device. \*Note: all content is available to users for free for the first month after registration. After the first month, users are able to access abstracts and full text news articles only; full text journal articles are unavailable without a personal mobile subscription.

## [OCLC WorldCat Mobile Web Beta](#)

Use the OCLC mobile interface to search for library materials, find a WorldCat library near you, call a library, or map a route.

## [WilsonWeb Mobile](#)

Search Bibliographic Index Plus, Book Review Digest Plus & Retro, Humanities & Social Science Retro, OmniFile Full Text Mega, and Readers' Guide Retro from your mobile device. Access is currently available on campus only. Libraries will need to provide either a URL, along with an ID and a Password; a customized URL which includes embedded authentication information; or a link found on a referring page set up by the library. ### **Preservation Tip: Celebrate Preservation Week**

April 24–30, 2011 will mark the second annual Preservation Week. Originally created as a public outreach program to assist the public in caring for their personal treasures, Preservation Week is also an opportunity to promote preservation within your own institution as well as creating openings to provide outreach within your community.

creating openings to provide education within your community.

Activities for Preservation Week can include:

- Book and paper repair demonstrations.
- Lectures on preserving personal collections such as digital photographs, home movie recordings, book collections, family documents, antique quilts, and more.
- Exhibits on how to care for collections showcasing items in your collections have been preserved and demonstrating how that was accomplished. See the preservation tips on [storage and handling](#), and [environmental concerns](#).
- Create bookmarks, [rainy day bags](#), and/or flyers with information on care and handling that list vendors where the public can purchase archival storage supplies.
- Daily emails to institutional Email lists with preservation trivia or facts.

These activities can be coordinated with other cultural heritage institutions in your area including public libraries, local museums, historical societies, genealogy centers, and school libraries or media centers.

Preservation Week can also be used as a good incentive to finish policies or projects that you are working on within your own institution. For example, if your institution does not have a disaster plan or if it has not been updated in the past year, use Preservation Week as a due date to help motivate you so you can announce the completion as part of your institution's Preservation Week efforts.
