Register by March 30 for "An Introduction to Technologies and Processes for the Care of Digital Collections"

Registration is now open for the forum "Digital Preservation: An Introduction to Technologies and Processes for the Care of Digital Collections" to be held on April 10 at the I-Hotel in Champaign. This day-long forum has been designed to give interested CARLI member libraries an overview of the principles and practices surrounding the emerging technologies associated with digital preservation.

Register for "Copyright and Fair Use in the Digital Age"

[Join us for a discussion](#) about copyright, fair use and the use and application of Creative Commons licenses in the library and higher education community. The event will be held twice, on April 16 in Chicago, and April 17 in Champaign. Speakers will include Brandon Butler, Association of Research Libraries; Peter Jaszi, American University Law School; and Sarah Hinchliff Pearson, Senior Counsel, Creative Commons. This event is open to library staff, legal counsel, faculty and staff at any Illinois institution. To register, [visit the event page](#). The content will be the same at both events. There will no fee to attend, but advance registration will be required.

What is fair use, and how can libraries use their fair use rights to accomplish their missions better, from preservation to support for scholarship and teaching to digitizing collections for public access? A path-breaking new document, the Code of Best Practices in Fair Use for Academic and Research Libraries, provides powerful new insight into the ways that librarians themselves apply fair use principles to resolve central and recurring copyright challenges.

In the first half of this event, Brandon Butler and Peter Jaszi, co-facilitators of the Code, will introduce the Code and address how its principles can help us solve local challenges and improve local policies dealing with copyright and fair use.

Recognizing the strains between the traditional use and application of copyright law with the expansive, universal access enabled by the Internet, Creative Commons (CC) created a framework to provide a balance between the reality of the Internet and the reality of copyright laws.

In the second half of the program, Sarah Hinchliff Pearson will look at the history and legal framework of CC licenses and public domain tools, and their effect upon proprietary information, patent and/or revenue generating initiatives. She will also address the relationship of fair use to CC licenses, how CC legal tools work with data, and the use of CC licenses by higher education institutions and individual faculty members.

These events are sponsored by the Association of Research Libraries, Creative Commons, Northwestern University, Southern Illinois University Carbondale, the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign, and CARLI.

This year, April 22th through the 28th will mark the third annual Preservation Week. Originally created as a public outreach program to assist the public in caring for their personal treasures, Preservation Week is also an opportunity to promote preservation within your own institution as well as creating openings to provide outreach within your community. Preservation Week is sponsored through ALA's Association of Library Collections and Technical Services (ALCTS) and the Preservation and Reformatting Section (PARS). This year's chair of Preservation Week, Julie Mosbo (SIUC), is also chair of CARLI's Preservation Working Group.

Grant Applications Sought for Preservation Assistance to Smaller Institutions

The National Endowment for the Humanities (NEH) offers grants for preservation assistance specifically for small to mid-size cultural heritage institutions. Awards of up to \$6000 are available to support the following types of preservation-related projects: general preservation assessments, consultations for specific preservation needs, allowances for specific types of preservation-related purchases (storage furniture, preservation supplies, environmental monitoring equipment), education and training, disaster/emergency planning, and consultation/planning for digital collections preservation.

Illinois Collections Preservation Network (ICPN) Disaster Recovery Workshops

Did you know that almost all disasters involve water? Do you know what to do if you are faced with a water emergency?

The Illinois Collections Preservation Network (ICPN) will be offering a series of disaster recovery workshops throughout 2012. These workshops are directed towards all types and sizes of museums, libraries, and archives. The dates and locations of the workshops are:

- April 18, 2012, Tuscola

- May 10, 2012, Macomb
- June 11, 2012, Naperville
- July 9, 2012, Freeport

The workshops will run from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. each day, and will include: developing a disaster plan, assessing risks, emergency supplies, salvage techniques, and a hands-on salvage experience. Lunch will be provided. The workshop is free but attendees need to register as members of the Illinois Collections Preservation Network (ICPN). Membership in ICPN is also free.
