








VUFIND





 Straight pass-through cost from vendor to library 		
 No surcharge applied to the cost 		
Why advantageous?		
 Substantial bargaining power of 128 libraries 		
Centrally negotiated and managed license agreements		
 Single consolidated invoice for multiple subscriptions 		
 Multi-year agreements, which give libraries greater cost predictability 		
• Discounts of at least 10% (usually much greater)		
• Capped annual price increases: average of 5%, which is extremely rare for e-resources		
About \$16.7 million total in CY17		
All available through the <i>very popular</i> CARLI Selection System

SHARED INSTITUTIONAL REPOSITORIES

Listening Sessions' Most Prevalent Topic: The Need for Shared Institutional Repositories

CARLI Board has charged an IR Investigative Task Force to:

- Investigate feasibility of shared IR's and suitable platforms
- Conduct an environmental scan
- Assess members' existing repository structures and inventory
- Task force's charge dictates recommendation cannot impede CARLI core services and must include self-funded solution

What is an institutional repository?

Clifford Lynch, Executive Director, Coalition for Networked Information, stated

stated "In my view, a university-based institutional repository is a set of services that a university offers to the members of its community for the management and dissemination of digital materials created by the institution and its community members. It is most essentially an organizational commitment to the stewardship of these digital materials, including long-term preservation where appropriate, as well as organization and access or distribution."
