

Resource sharing is highly valued

- Crowdfunding can work
- Member support provides great access and ownership!
 - More than what any one member can individually purchase

- CARLI provided 702 paid registrations to ELUNA Learns 2020 and 2021 sessions for members
- CARLI staff presented 85 topical webinars between July 2020-June 2021 on Alma and Primo VE including:
 - Open Office Hours
 - Tech Services and Resource Sharing topical sessions
 - Recap sessions following Ex Libris training webinars
- CARLI staff held hundreds of direct conversations with members on Alma configurations and settings



- Voyager resource sharing suspended March 2020
- Alma launched June 24, 2020
- Alma AFN (Automated Fulfillment Network) resource sharing enabled as libraries were able to provide service
 - 52 institutions by August 17, 2020
 - 77 institutions by November 1, 2020
 - 83 institutions by February 1, 2021
 - Today, all 89 I-Share libraries have AFN enabled to the level appropriate for their institution



I-SHARE 2020-2021: A YEAR OF SETTLING IN AND "RIGHT-SIZING"

- Implementing single sign-on for Alma and Primo VE
 - 69 I-Share institutions (24 non-I-Share institutions) using OpenAthens (CARLI pays for through June 2023)
- Establishing data feeds for patron records
 - 74 participants successfully implemented and running Alma SIS (Student Information System) synchronizations
- Learning how to make use of Alma and Primo VE's abilities to manage and optimize discovery of e-resources as well as physical resources, both at the institution and consortium level
- Deduplicating bib records and eliminating unused records



I-SHARE 2021: TITLE AND USER CLEANUP PROJECT

- CARLI staff know that this project is a distraction that your staff had not planned for
- Consequently, CARLI took an unprecedented step for our consortium to contract external cataloging staff to perform as much of the data work as possible
- The CARLI Office staff identify records that can be deleted/merged/or moved to Network Zone records, and provide these reports to I-Share library staff to review, saving library staff the time and effort of finding these data
- I-Share libraries may opt to do the data work themselves or have CARLI do it for them at no charge to the library
- Every I-Share library is different, so we are offering consultation sessions with individual libraries about their data cleanup options. Contact us to schedule one for your library!





What are CARLI's FY21 revenue sources?

I-Share, the Library Services Platform

The I-Share library services platform serves as the online public catalog for 89 CARLI member libraries, including the three University of Illinois libraries.

I-Share is more than a catalog; it enables discovery and sharing of all materials among libraries. Especially with recent campus reductions to members' budgets, that sharing is essential to meet student and faculty research needs.

I-Share is named as CARLI's most valued service by members

 - 38 million items, a shared collection that ranks among the world's largest research libraries

- Caring for the Library Outsider: a Pedagogy of Care for Academic Librarians
- Rebecca Donald, Trinity International University
 - Interviewed 26 librarians (16 were CARLI members) about a feminist pedagogy of care for academic librarians
 - Currently compiling the results of these interviews
 - Themes of note include:
 - The challenges of caring for students during the COVID-19 pandemic
 - A passion for DEI (diversity, equity, and inclusion) initiatives in libraries
 - Library directors considering how to care well for their staff
