- Six contract renewals either completed or in process, including new contract for Syndetics Unbound
- Advocating for lowest possible price increases
 - Many vendors still have flat pricing.
 - CARLI members sharing their stories of budget issues has helped CARLI advocate with vendors for lower pricing



- Caring for the Library Outsider: a Pedagogy of Care for Academic Librarians
- Rebecca Donald, Trinity International University
 - Interviewed 26 librarians (16 were CARLI members) about a feminist pedagogy of care for academic librarians
 - Currently compiling the results of these interviews
 - Themes of note include:
 - The challenges of caring for students during the COVID-19 pandemic
 - A passion for DEI (diversity, equity, and inclusion) initiatives in libraries
 - Library directors considering how to care well for their staff

Project results will be presented in a webinar for CARLI in the coming year.

CARLI completed its migration to cloud-based services

- No more server farms
- Saves dollars on rent and equipment replacement
- Reduces staff time for upkeep



ILDS: ILLINOIS LIBRARY DELIVERY SERVICE





- ILDS has returned to five-day-a-week delivery.
- Both RAILS and IHLS have ended the quarantine of items. CARLI is no longer recommending libraries quarantine outgoing ILDS items.
- 276,751 items delivered through ILDS in FY21
 - approximately half of the volume before the COVID-19 pandemic in FY20



CARLI serves as a coordinator for important initiatives like creating open educational resources, assessment of library impact, submitting grant requests, and providing training and education for members.

CARLI helps make Illinois academic and research libraries world-class by providing:

- · E-resources (articles, maps, images, books) from all disciplines
- Print books accessible to students from all over the world
- Trained staff ready to focus on students' needs

What are CARLI's FY21 revenue sources?

- University of Illinois System Office: \$3.5 million
- CARLI Membership Fees and assessments for optional services: \$2.2 million
- · Pass-through revenue:
 - Subscriptions to databases: \$14.5 million
 - Delivery grant from the Secretary of State/Illinois State Library: \$855,000

What do members say about CARLI?

- CARLI links the profession and is depended on to enrich professional lives.
- CARLI helps libraries level the playing field.
- The value of colleagues working together—community colleges, private institutions, public institutions, small and large—is that the collaboration makes so many projects possible and gives members a springboard to shape important library services.
- The relatively modest investment the State of Illinois and members make impacts millions statewide.
- CARLI has tremendous potential to coordinate strategic best practices.
- Members need a healthy CARLI to stay vibrant locally; CARLI's success is inseparable from member libraries' success.

I-Share, the Library Services Platform

The I-Share library services platform serves as the online public catalog for 89 CARLI member libraries, including the three University of Illinois libraries.

I-Share is more than a catalog; it enables discovery and sharing of all materials among libraries. Especially with recent campus reductions to members' budgets, that sharing is essential to meet student and faculty research needs.

I-Share is named as CARLI's most valued service by members

- Resource sharing benefits impact all Illinois residents
- The power of the shared catalog
 - o 38 million items, a shared collection that ranks among the world's largest research libraries
 - o collections throughout the state delivered in 24 hours
- I-Share libraries could not operate a separate system for a comparable cost
 - o staff, software, administration, staff education
- · I-Share familiarity
 - o transferring students move to new Illinois schools with an advantage

Without I-Share

- Students and faculty would be immediately and adversely impacted...
 - o Campuses would be forced to buy or borrow needed materials at additional expense.

I-SHARE 2020-2021: A YEAR OF LEARNING

- CARLI provided 702 paid registrations to ELUNA Learns 2020 and 2021 sessions for members
- CARLI staff presented 85 topical webinars between July 2020-June 2021 on Alma and Primo VE including:
 - Open Office Hours
 - Tech Services and Resource Sharing topical sessions
 - Recap sessions following Ex Libris training webinars
- CARLI staff held hundreds of direct conversations with members on Alma configurations and settings



I-SHARE 2020-2021: A YEAR OF STARTING FRESH

- Voyager resource sharing suspended March 2020
- Alma launched June 24, 2020
- Alma AFN (Automated Fulfillment Network) resource sharing enabled as libraries were able to provide service
 - 52 institutions by August 17, 2020
 - 77 institutions by November 1, 2020
 - 83 institutions by February 1, 2021
 - Today, all 89 I-Share libraries have AFN enabled to the level appropriate for their institution



I-SHARE 2020-2021: A YEAR OF SETTLING IN AND "RIGHT-SIZING"

- Implementing single sign-on for Alma and Primo VE
 - 69 I-Share institutions (24 non-I-Share institutions) using OpenAthens (CARLI pays for through June 2023)
- Establishing data feeds for patron records
 - 74 participants successfully implemented and running Alma SIS (Student Information System) synchronizations
- Learning how to make use of Alma and Primo VE's abilities to manage and optimize discovery of e-resources as well as physical resources, both at the institution and consortium level
- Deduplicating bib records and eliminating unused records

- CARLI staff know that this project is a distraction that your staff had not planned for
- Consequently, CARLI took an unprecedented step for our consortium to contract external cataloging staff to perform as much of the data work as possible
- The CARLI Office staff identify records that can be deleted/merged/or moved to Network Zone records, and provide these reports to I-Share library staff to review, saving library staff the time and effort of finding these data
- I-Share libraries may opt to do the data work themselves or have CARLI do it for them at no charge to the library
- Every I-Share library is different, so we are offering consultation sessions with individual libraries about their data cleanup options. Contact us to schedule one for your library!




