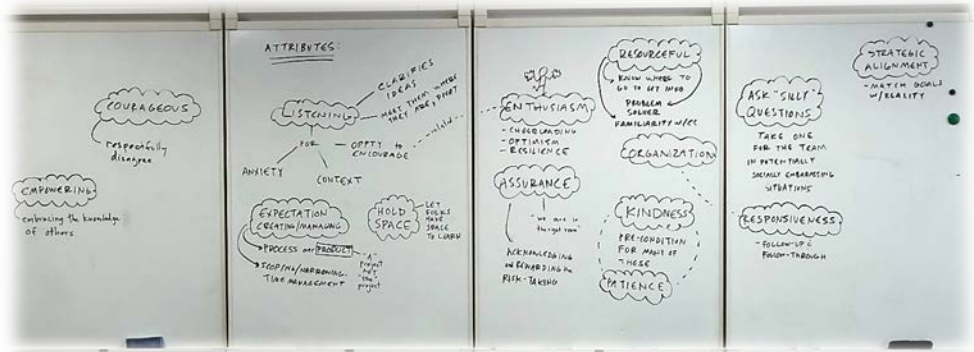


CARLI Counts Update
