Project title:

Zotero promotion and support: promote best practices and enable integration.

Description of the proposed research project including methodology and scope:

To provide a survey of current Zotero use, to develop a web site of supporting material to promote the tool (posters, technical support, tutorials), and to capture any increase in use and/or testimonials of individual use and curriculum integrated experiences.

Work plan for accomplishing this project:

Distribute an initial survey of current use and support models, to develop documentation for the promotion of the tool, and to provide a follow-up survey to demonstrate best practices, adoption, and testimonials by users.

Projected outcomes in support of the [CARLI Strategic Priorities](#):

To provide a clearinghouse of expertise and support materials, and coordinate the assessment of the adoption of this important information fluency tool that advances user skills from discovery to Knowledge Management.

The effort relates to the following priorities

- Connect institutions that have similar interests/needs by providing opportunities for interaction and collaboration

- Provide mechanisms for group collaboration; identify and leverage model programs, initiatives, and ideas

Evaluation plan:

To implement a follow-up survey recording any increase in adoption of the tool, to develop a clearinghouse of best practices documentation, and the monitoring of a newly created online support community (either on a CARLI server or on the diigo platform).

Statement describing how this project fits into the existing literature:

Zotero is a powerful knowledge management tool that expands user skills from traditional citation management into a more robust knowledge management suite of tools. While Zotero is becoming a recognized tool supported by some libraries, there are no articles about a strategic support model coordinated by a library consortium. CARLI can take a lead role in demonstrating how a consortium can effectively promote proactive best practices.

Statement outlining how this project will benefit the Illinois library community and the broader profession:

This project will result in a coordinated network support model sharing best practices, and the creation of an online community for further explorations.

Dissemination plan for how the results of the project will be shared:

We will distribute posters and online tutorials, distribute survey results leading to future developments, and develop and sustain an online support community.

3 months = distribute survey and hold focus groups.

3 months = design promotion services, materials, and an online clearinghouse and community.

3 months = rollout of materials and population of the online community.

3 months = for follow-up survey and recording of adoption and integrated efforts.
