Mission and values

In FY22, the Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion Task Force revised the CARLI mission and values. These revisions, along with amendments to the CARLI Bylaws are set for a membership vote in Fall 2022.

CARLI Mission

CARLI adds value for all member libraries by sharing costs, collections, expertise, programs, products, and services.

Open Illinois Initiative

The CARLI Open Illinois Initiative is a commitment to facilitate members' use and support of Open Educational Resources (OER) especially training, advocacy, and coordination of cooperative efforts for the benefit of Illinois higher education students.

Illinois SCOERs (Support for the Creation of Open Educational Resources)

The University of Illinois System/CARLI was awarded a three-year, \$1.08 million grant from the US Department of Education's Open Textbooks Pilot Program, a competitive grant program based on US Senate Majority Whip and Illinois Senator Richard Durbin's Affordable College Textbook Act. The grant will fund Illinois SCOERs (Support for Creation of Open Educational Resources), a program that will provide access to open textbooks and personalized learning tools for entry-level courses in high-demand health care and human development career paths.

In Round One, CARLI was able to fund nine innovative projects representing thirteen institutions across the state. Among the institutions are community colleges, state

universities, and private colleges and universities. Two of the nine grants represent multiinstitutional collaborations.

The nine Round One Illinois SCOERs Subgrant Awards totaling \$493,902.55 are:

Open Illinois Hub on OER Commons

CARLI launched the Open Illinois Hub on OER Commons in FY22. The Open Illinois Hub facilitates the use of Open Educational Resources (OER) and supports training, advocacy, and coordination of cooperative efforts for the benefit of members of the Consortium of Academic and Research Libraries in Illinois (CARLI), and other Illinois stakeholders. This centralized repository provides materials helpful to academic and research institutions in developing OER and advocating for adoption of OER on their campuses to reduce students' costs.

The Open Illinois Hub is a customized, branded resource on OER Commons where our network of users can create and share their locally created open educational resources and collections, have an institutional presence, or work collaboratively, and share news and events associated with a project or organization. By combining resources from many CARLI member institutions into a seamless environment, faculty, staff, students, and the public are able to search across Illinois institutions and collections.

I-Share

CARLI Staff presented nearly 50 topical webinars in support of I-Share, this includes our Open Office hours, Tech Services Q&A, and the Let's Talk about Fulfillment sessions.

CARLI Staff resolved over 2,000 support inquiries about Ex Libris Alma/Primo VE during FY22. Additionally, over 100 cases were opened with Ex Libris to address Alma and Primo VE related issues on behalf of our I-Share members.

CARLI continued its support of ELUNA Learns registrations for members, providing 355 registrations for staff at I-Share member libraries.

Following CARLI's June 2020 migration to Ex Libris Alma/Primo VE, CARLI turned its attention to record cleanup. The University of Illinois System Office provided funds for CARLI to focus effort on cleanup and named user reduction through a contract with the Cataloging Maintenance Center at the Illinois Heartland Library System.

CARLI Counts

CARLI Counts is a continuing education library leadership immersion program that prepares librarians to make effective use of research findings on the impact of academic libraries on student success for the twin purposes of service development and library advocacy. Program participants learn how to use local library data analytics in alignment with institutional data, goals, and strategic priorities to improve their services and demonstrate their value.

CARLI Counts Cohort 3 was held in 2021. This was the first cohort to be held entirely virtually. Presentations of the teams' projects were showcased at the November 2022 CARLI Annual Meeting. CARLI Counts is supported by a Laura Bush 21st Century Librarian Grant from the Institute of Museum and Library Services and CARLI.

Professional Development Alliance of Library Consortia

CARLI's second year participating in the Professional Development Alliance of Library Consortia (PDA) presented members with new opportunities for education, training, and awareness that would otherwise not have been possible. The PDA is a cooperative program of ten U.S. library consortia to bring no-cost virtual continuing education to library staff across the country. CARLI members were presented with the opportunity to attend 274 programs offered by all PDA members since this collaboration began. 5192 library staff registered specifically for 46 programs hosted by CARLI.

Ebook Program

During CARLI's Ebook Program in FY22, 70 members contributed \$452,500. This funding purchased perpetual access to 1,835 Wiley Online Books and 636 Oxford University Press Ebooks. During the project year, members had access to 23,000+ Wiley Online Books that included all subjects as well as all years available within the Wiley Online Library. All titles had unlimited access for CARLI members through June 30, 2022, and could be used as course

materials or for course reserves. Direct links could be embedded into course management systems.

CARLI Scholarship

The CARLI Scholarship helps to grow the profession by providing financial assistance to current employees of CARLI Governing Member Libraries pursuing graduate studies leading to a master's degree in Library and Information Science at the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign. Building Diversity Graduate Assistantships

CARLI's Building Diversity Assistantship Program (BDGAP) seeks to improve equity, diversity, and inclusion in Illinois academic libraries by supporting persons from traditionally underrepresented minority groups who are enrolled in the master's degree program in Library and Information Science at the University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign with positions at CARLI member libraries. The assistantships, being awarded for the first time in FY22, provide a small stipend and tuition.

Funding for the program for academic years 2022/2023 and 2023/2024 is provided by CARLI and the University of Illinois System. CARLI member libraries hosting graduate assistants through CARLI for the 2022/2023 academic year are the Chicago Theological Seminary, Loyola University Chicago, Moraine Valley Community College, and the University of Illinois Chicago.

Sarah Rebecca Velazquez Gaglio and Wardah Mohammed are the recipients of the <u>Building Diversity Graduate Assistantships</u> for the 2022/2023 academic year. The assistantships will ultimately provide experience, mentoring, and networking to participants with the goal of increasing the number of staff members from underrepresented groups at Illinois' two and four-year public and private college and university libraries.

I-Share Assessments

CARLI's Assessment Task Force recalculated the I-Share formula in FY22. Prices were set through FY27.

CARLI's Funding Principles were established:

- Ensure that CARLI members have at least 24 months' notice for their individual fee/assessment rates.
- Recalculate rates every three years to avoid drastic changes in rates.
- Use data that are easily obtainable from reliable sources.
- Buffer members' increases with escalating periods to reach any new amount gradually.

CARLI Digital Collections

CARLI Digital Collections (CDC) is a repository for digital content created by member libraries, or purchased by CARLI for use by its members, run on OCLC's CONTENTdm software platform. CARLI Digital Collections provides access to myriad special collections, including images, printed and manuscript materials, sound recordings, and more totaling 3.1 TB. Use of CARLI Digital Collections and CONTENTdm is offered for free to CARLI member institutions. Of the 353 collections in CDC, 13 were added in FY2022, including collections from two new CARLI institutions that had not contributed to CDC until this year.

DPLA and IDHH

CARLI continued its work on the Illinois Digital Heritage Hub, the Illinois hub at the Digital Public Library of America.

In FY22, IDHH contributed over 420,000 metadata records to DPLA from:

Manifold Pilot

The CARLI Office is pleased to be one of seventeen participants in the Open Education Network's (OEN) newly launched Manifold Pilot. In this pilot, librarians, faculty, and scholars at participating institutions and organizations will experiment with Manifold, an open-source publishing workflow, developed in collaboration between the CUNY Graduate Center, the University of Minnesota Press, and Cast Iron Coding. Manifold may be used for a variety of open educational publishing practices, as seen in examples from California Digital Library and Affordable Learning Georgia.

The pilot will provide participants with an extended opportunity to work on a range of creative open education publishing, pedagogy and curation projects to meet the local needs of their communities. During the pilot, CARLI staff will learn how to use the platform to create an open textbook.

The OEN was selected as one of six organizations to join the Manifold community in 2022 with a grant-funded support package, thanks to generous funding from The Andrew W. Mellon Foundation. The OEN will receive one year of grant-funded managed hosting, training, and support. The OEN has committed to providing an additional year of Manifold access, through March 2024. At the conclusion of the pilot, the group will share what they learn with the broader OEN community and make recommendations as to whether the OEN offers Manifold for community use in the future. CARLI will share this information with the membership.

Other highlights

- The 2021 CARLI's Annual Meeting and Directors' Meeting were held virtually.
- Funded through a CARLI Research Award, CARLI made available Zotero posters for member libraries. Zotero is a free and open-source reference management software to manage bibliographic data and related research materials that allows users to collect, annotate, organize, cite, and share their research materials. PDF versions of the posters are also available for download and/or local printing from the "HELP" section of the CARLI Zotero instruction clearinghouse.
- In FY22, CARLI began the process of migrating to a completely virtual workplace. Following the COVID-19 Pandemic, CARLI staff were practiced in working remotely. CARLI will begin renting office space at the Illinois Heartland Library System in Champaign in February 2023 to have meeting and small group space.
- CARLI completed its migration to all cloud-based services. Server farms were decommissioned in FY22.
- ILDS (the Illinois Library Delivery Service) returned to operations after the pandemic in FY22.
- New contract for Syndetics Unbound from ProQuest. CARLI renewed contracts for the American Mathematical Society, the Association for Community Machinery, Duke University Press, eHRAF, and John Hopkins University Press.
