What is autoholdings?

- Automated process where all ProQuest Ebook Central titles are activated in Alma
- Ex Libris documentation calls it "Upload Electronic Holdings"




Is this new?

- Autoholdings existed previously
 - Only for owned and DDA titles
 - Updated weekly or less frequent
- Autoholdings with new "enhanced integration profile"
 - Owned, DDA, and Subscription
 - Updated daily
 - Updates appear in 24 to 48 hours
 - Purchase model indication for each portfolio



How does it work?





3. Activate & Manage customer specific electronic holdings in Alma

Proguest. Part of Clarivate 1. Call ProQuest Ebook Central with customer specific ID at ProQuest Ebook Central (SiteID)

ProQuest Ebook Central

2. **Daily** retrieve customer specific electronic holdings:

- DDA titles
- Owned Titles
- Subscription

What are the benefits?

- Daily incremental loads of all Ebook Central content: owned, DDA, and subscribed titles.
- No manual activations for individual titles in Ebook Central.
- Once a DDA title is triggered for purchase, the purchase model will be updated via autoholdings in the next daily load.
- Territorial restrictions are not an issue because autoholdings only delivers the titles an institution has access to.
- Set up reports to show any changes or deletions.



What are the considerations?

- Must use the *Ebook Central Perpetual, DDA, and Subscription titles* Community Zone collection.
- Enhanced or customized records can be difficult to retain and maintain.
- To participate in the Training and Consulting Partner-led project, you must activate all Ebook Central content.
 - Owned, DDA, and subscription
 - Can proceed on your own if you do not want all Ebook Central content.
- Each institution is different → individual consultations are needed.




Example consultation questions

- Do you use Alma to maintain your purchasing data (PO Lines) for Ebook Central ebooks?
- If so, how does that order information get into Alma?
- How do you manage Ebook Central records in Alma?
 - Community Zone, Institution Zone, Free-Floating Portfolios
- If you use Community Zone records, are you making any adjustments to those records once you activate titles?

- Upload Electronic Holdings from ProQuest Ebook
 Central for
 Subscriptions/Owned/DDA
 (Ex Libris Knowledge Center Article)
 - If you participate in the TCPled project, TCPs and Ex Libris will take care of the steps in the "<u>Self-Service Workflow</u>"



ProQuest Ebook Central Upload Electronic Holdings integration allows you to automatically manage (activate/deactivate) the electronic resources to which you have access via the ProQuest Ebook Central platform (based on your Ebook Central site ID). This service eliminates the need for human intervention when activating the electronic resources of the Ebook Central platform for any electronic title, whether it is part of a subscription, a PDA/DDA program, or individually owned/purchased titles.

ProQuest Ebook Central Upload Electronic Holdings integration handles the following ProQuest Ebook Central titles:

- Owned Ebook titles that were purchased as perpetual-access, single Ebook titles
- Subscription Ebook titles that are part of a subscription (live or on trial)
- DDA Ebook titles that are part of the ProQuest PDA/DDA (Patron Driven Acquisition/Demand Driven Acquisition)
 program

Once all the configurations have been set up, the Alma Ebook Central workflow works as per the below:
