

OPEN OFFICE HOURS DATA REVIEW & THE NETWORK ZONE

- Your library's records migrate to your IZ.
- P2E conversion moves your URLs into portfolios (which replace MFHDs)
- IZ bibs match to NZ bibs using OCLC numbers in the 035\$a and/or 035\$z
 - On match, you inherit the shared NZ bib record
 - If no matches, or too many, your IZ bib is unlinked.
 - Reports on unlinked records will be provided
 - After go live, libraries may adopt matching on any 035 data

NETWORK ZONE: INDICATIONS OF A NETWORK ZONE BIB



The p2e conversion will have moved your library's URL into the portfolio record.

- CARLI created a new record set for the NZ
 - Your Voyager bibs with OCLC numbers in 035s
 - Your records without OCLC numbers are unlinked
 - E.g., short/acq bibs, vendor eResource bibs
 - No bibs that shouldn't be in the union catalog
 - 049 \$u nouc; suppressed bibs
 - Bibs with no holdings
 - Use of quality hierarchy
 - For same bib 035: EncLvl I > blank > K > 8 > 3
- Goal: Create a better set of shared bibs

Data Review and Acceptance

- Use well-formatted records that exemplify different characteristics of your library's data to verify that data migrated correctly
 - According to the Voyager to Alma Migration Guide
 - According to your migration specifications
 - According to the types of data
- Select different records for different data scenarios
 - Are the MARC data still correct?
 - Are non-MARC data in the right fields?
 - Does the user interface display data predictably?

EFFECTS OF THE IZ-NZ RELATIONSHIP ON METADATA REVIEW AND ACCEPTANCE

- Bib record test cases
 - Depend on whether record is IZ or NZ
 - Depend on whether the data being checked is in the bib
- For test cases involving data found in mfhds, items, order lines: test as normal

- #1. When bib is an NZ record contributed by another library
- Verify match is correct
- Verify your inventory first
 - Mfhds & items
 - Portfolios for e-Resources
 - Orders as needed
 - Reading lists as needed
- Verify your local extensions
- Review your migrated bib to verify bib test case

Remember, if your library didn't contribute the bib, the contents are likely different from your copy; but that is not necessarily a problem.

#2. When bib is an NZ record contributed by your library

- Verify match is correct
- Verify your test case
- Verify your local extensions
- Review other bib data
 - Specifically, look at the MARC fields, not the Alma UI display
 - Compare like to like
- Verify your inventory
 - Mfhds & items, Portfolios for e-Resources
 - Orders and Reading lists as needed

In this scenario, if what you see is different from what's in your Voyager data, you may have a problem.


#3. When bib is an IZ record not shared with the NZ

- Verify your test case
- Local extensions will look like other fields
- Review other bib data
 - Specifically, look at the MARC fields, not the Alma UI display
 - Compare like to like
- Verify your inventory
 - Mfhds & items, Portfolios for e-Resources
 - Orders and Reading lists as needed

In this scenario, if what you see is different from what's in your Voyager data, you may have a problem. However, a bib not linked to the NZ is not necessarily a problem for now.


REVIEW YOUR LOCAL EXTENSION SELECTIONS

- Your Box folder > XXX Production Load >
 Alma Production Migration Form XXX_FINAL.xlsm
- Row 30: "Specify bib tags which will be marked as local...
 - 590##; 77###; 78###; 95###; 957##; 958##; 959##



Remember, local extensions are tags applied in the IZ for an NZ record. IZ-only bibs do not need local extensions.

• Your original bib is reviewable in the metadata editor: Tools > View versions of original record.

Row 4: "A record that contains repeated fields"

- E.g., multiple 246 or 700, some of which you added
- NZ bib may match what's in WorldCat, i.e., with fewer tags

Row 8: "A record at encoding level 8"

- NZ bib might have EncLvl K or I
- NZ bib might have different 035\$\$a





ALSO, A FEW THINGS THAT MIGHT LOOK WRONG BUT AREN'T

- Bib record *Material Type* doesn't match Leader/06-07 in title results display
 - Alma's list is shorter than the actual list of formats
 - Tip: Compare the actual Leader values in MARC
- Item record *Material Type* doesn't match Leader/06-07
 - Alma contains a table of Physical Item Material Types
 - Extrapolated from item types and bib 007 at migration
 - In some cases, what you get is a guess.
 - It's actually NEW data, and is correctable after go live
- Another library's proxy is in my bib 856
 - For NZ records, the 856 will be that of the contributing library
 - Your 856—if you marked this record for P2E—will be in the portfolio: Electronic > View (portfolio) > Linking tab
